Position description

The Department of Medicine of McGill University invites applications for a full-time position as a member of the Contract Academic Staff (Clinical) as a clinician-scientist at the rank of Assistant Professor. The successful candidate will also be appointed to clinical practice in the Department of Medicine, Division of Rheumatology at the McGill University Health Centre (MUHC). This candidate must be interested in pursuing a strong academic career and have a particular interest and expertise in the area of pulmonary involvement in patients with systemic autoimmune rheumatic diseases. This position does not confer eligibility for tenure. The position is expected to begin in the fall of 2021.

The Department of Medicine is a leader in academic medicine, our educational and research missions support excellent and innovative clinical programs across our teaching hospitals. The McGill University Health Centre (MUHC) is one of McGill's major teaching hospitals affiliated with the Faculty of Medicine and Health Science at Canada's internationally renowned McGill University, located in the vibrant and multicultural city of Montreal, in the province of Quebec.

The Division of Rheumatology of the MUHC has an international reputation for its outstanding research programs and for its innovative high-level multispecialty care of patients with complex systemic autoimmune rheumatic diseases. Programs with clinical care and research integration are promoted and already exist in the fields of Systemic Lupus Erythematosus, Rheumatoid Arthritis, Vasculitis and Spondyloarthropathies. The successful candidate would be expected to integrate a pulmonary disease research program within these existing programs.

Job Duties

As a clinician-scientist it is expected that the candidate will apply for external operating and personal support from the appropriate funding agencies (i.e. CIHR, FRQ-S). Should the candidate be successful securing additional sources of funding, the candidate will be expected to devote a minimum of 50%-75% time to research. The candidate will provide clinical services including rotation on the in-patient consultation service as well as out-patient services.

The candidate is also expected to be actively involved in all aspects of McGill's academic mission (teaching and supervision of clinical trainees, graduate students and involvement in academic and administrative committees) and will be expected to demonstrate a commitment to equity, diversity and inclusion in these activities.

Qualifications and Education requirements

Candidates must hold an MD degree and have completed Internal Medicine training, followed by subspecialty training in Rheumatology; be certified by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada (or equivalent) and be eligible for licensure in Quebec and certification by the College des Médecins du Quebec.

In addition, candidates must have completed advanced training including an MSc or PhD degree, as well as post-doctoral fellowship training pertinent to rheumatology with a focus on pulmonary manifestations of rheumatic diseases. The candidate must demonstrate a high level of scientific productivity, evidenced by recent publications, success in funding, and/or distinction awards.

All candidates must be fluent in English with a working knowledge of French.
